When you return in October you will see some changes to the club. Over the summer there has been nearly \$400,000 spent in upgrades. There is a new ramp and canopy installed on the front of the building, as well as accessibility upgrades on the interior. The biggest project has been the replacement of the ice plant. Work has been ongoing throughout the summer, and the new plant should be ready to start up this Wednesday! Last year part of the plant failed, and with such an important season, we didn't want to take the chance of a total breakdown. The new plant is a tremendous investment in the future of the club. The design also calls for a heating recovery system that we hope will be installed in the coming years.

For the first time, we have offered junior curling registration online. The interest has far exceeded expectations, but we still have room to grow. So please spread the word to as many people as possible. Note that we have a new league called Youth Learn to Curl on Saturdays from 12-1pm.

We will be using a new registration system this year called Curling I/O. It will make league management much easier, with schedules and results being posted the same way you would see for Curling Canada events. With this new system, all curlers participating in leagues will need the be registered and paid online by **October 11th at 7:00pm.**

The calendar of events for the whole year is available on the main page of the website, so be sure to check out what events are scheduled for this season.

This year we want to take full advantage of the exposure gained from the Brier, and to do that we need **YOUR** help!
